Systematic Theology

Systematic Theology is the contemporary intellectual reflection on the content of divine revelation as an interrelated whole. It engages historical, dogmatic, and descriptive theological contributions within the Christian tradition while being sensitive to the socio-cultural contexts and dynamics within which these issues emerge.

At Boston College, systematic theologians teach:

- core courses in Christian theology,
- undergraduate electives focusing on a particular topic within systematic theology,
- specialized graduate courses and seminars in systematic theology.

Position Description

The Boston College [Theology Department](#) announces a full-time tenure-track faculty opening in Systematic Theology at the rank of assistant or associate professor. Preferred specializations include spirituality, sacramentality, and embodiment. Applicants conversant with feminist theologies through an intersectional lens are especially encouraged to apply. Doctoral training in Systematic Theology is required. Responsibilities include teaching two courses each semester: undergraduate core courses in Christian theology, as well as more specialized undergraduate and graduate courses. Applicants should have a record of scholarship in their field and a commitment to excellence in teaching at both the graduate and undergraduate levels.

This position is an appointment within the [Theology Department](#) and the successful candidate will participate fully in the academic life of the Department. The faculty member will teach two courses each semester (which by agreement with the Department Chair may include Theology Core courses, graduate seminars, or undergraduate electives) and advise graduate and undergraduate students. The tenure and promotion process will proceed through the Theology Department.

This appointment will begin in July 2024, with teaching duties beginning mid-August 2024.

Completion of PhD required by August 31, 2024.
