The Latin American, Latinx, and Caribbean Studies (LALCS) program and the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies (CIS) at the College of the Holy Cross invite applications for a two-year postdoctoral teaching fellowship in Migration Studies to begin August 2020. The search committee seeks fellows whose interdisciplinary research addresses Latin American migrations from one or more of the following perspectives: migration and (im)mobilities, urban and gang-related violence, systemic economic and political factors affecting migratory flows, legal systems, gender and sexuality, labor geographies, or Christian social ethics. Candidates whose research and teaching profiles can also contribute to Latinx or Caribbean topics, as well as other interdisciplinary programs in CIS and in the College will be given particular consideration.

This position carries a 2-1 teaching load. Postdoctoral fellows are eligible for travel support and reimbursement of relocation costs within the College's published policies. All full-time appointments offer competitive salaries and include full benefits. QUALIFICATIONS

Candidates must demonstrate a commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching at the introductory and advanced levels as well as scholarly achievement. Ph.D. required. For those currently in a doctoral program, Ph.D. must be completed by August 2020. Ph.D. in Ethnic Studies, Theology/Religious Studies (with an emphasis on social ethics), or other related fields from the humanities or social sciences are welcome. Strong preference will be given to those who have received their Ph.D. since 2017.

Please submit a cover letter addressing the position requirements listed above, a curriculum vitae, a statement on teaching, 2-3 sample syllabi of courses the candidate would like to teach, transcripts, and three confidential letters of recommendation.
