### Theology and Intersectionality

The Department of Theology and Religious Studies in the College of Arts & Sciences at Seattle University seeks candidates for a tenure-track Assistant Professor of either Catholic theological ethics or Catholic systematic theology or related discipline with expertise in theology at the intersection of race, ethnicity, class, gender, sexuality and/or disability beginning September 2023.

The ideal candidate will have a strong commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching, solid scholarly potential, and a demonstrated commitment to diversity and the university's mission, values, and vision. Candidates who can contribute to interdisciplinary programs in Catholic Studies, African and African American Studies, Latin American and Latinx Studies, Asian Studies, and/or Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies are encouraged to apply.

The Theology and Religious Studies Department offers courses for the Core Curriculum and a major and minor. For THRS majors, there are two possible specializations: Christian Theology and Comparative Religion.

Responsibilities will include teaching undergraduate theology courses, primarily in the University's Core Curriculum, as well as for the major and minor in Theology and Religious Studies; developing a robust research and writing agenda; and providing service to the department, college, university, and profession.

Minimum Qualifications: Ph.D. in theological ethics, systematic theology, or related discipline by September 2023; expertise in Catholic theology; demonstrated or potential excellence in teaching and scholarship.
