

Julia Feder, Ph.D. (University of Notre Dame) is an associate professor of theology at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. She specializes in theological anthropology, theologies of suffering, sexual trauma and human evolution. Her current book project, titled *Saving Grace: Sexual Trauma and Christian Salvation*, details how Christian ideas about salvation have contributed to sexual violence in our communities but also can foster resistance to sexual violence and even support posttraumatic healing. At Creighton, she leads an interdisciplinary research team to investigate the ways that the Jesuits handled the case of Daniel Kenney, a former Jesuit priest who taught theology and sex education at Creighton Preparatory School until he was dismissed after a credible accusation of sexual abuse of a student in 1989.
